

Pennock City Council Meeting
Tuesday, December 1, 2020

Pennock City Council held their regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, December 1, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. at the Pennock Community Center. The following members were present Mayor Kevin Crowley, Council members Jeff Arends and Laurie Maresch. Absent was Council member Bruce Bastin. Also present was Donovan Peters and Deputy Levi Brown and Deputy Riley Kampsen.

Mayor Crowley called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Motion by Council member Maresch to accept the Agenda as presented; Council member Arends seconds the motion. The motion passed.

Motion by Council member Arends to approve the Consent Agenda which consisted of the November 12, 2020 Canvassing Board minutes, the November 12, 2020 Council minutes and to pay all the December claims; Council member Maresch seconds the motion. The motion passed.

Deputy Levi Brown was present for the sheriff's report. For the month of November there were 40.25 hours. Deputy Brown introduced Deputy Riley Kampsen, who will be the new contract Deputy for the City starting in January 2021.

Verizon Tower at the Brush Site – The City received a draft of a land lease agreement. Motion by Council member Arends to move forward; Council member Maresch seconds the motion. The motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS

Polling Place – Mayor Crowley presented a Resolution Designating the Polling Place for the City of Pennock. Motion by Council member Maresch to designate the Pennock Community Center as the polling place for the elections; Council member Arends seconds the motion. Roll call vote was taken with Council member Arends and Maresch in favor and Mayor Crowley in favor. The motion passed.

OTHER BUSINESS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

It was mentioned that the LMCIT No-Fault Sewer Back-up and Water Main Break Coverage will continue from 03/15/2021 – 03/15/2022.

Clerk Johnson presented a copy of the Local Mitigation Survey (LMS) that she completed for the Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan.
