Pennock City Council held their regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, March 3, 2026 at 7:00 p.m. at the Pennock Community Center. The following members were present Mayor Kevin Crowley, Council members Bruce Bastin, Lance Crowe and Shane Dillabough. Absent was Council member Jeff Arends. Also present were Deputy Meghan Dimler, resident Jim Kidrowski and Mike Schackman, Gene Ward with Webtomix LLC and maintenance employee Nolan Smith. Mayor Crowley called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.
