

Pennock City Council Meeting
Monday, November 14, 2022

Pennock City Council held their regular monthly meeting on Monday, November 14, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. at the Pennock Community Center. The following members were present Mayor Kevin Crowley, Council members Jeff Arends, Bruce Bastin and Karen Skaggs. Absent was Council member Dave Miller. Also present were residents Kerry Gross, Abigail Reinhart and Kayla Puchalski.

Mayor Crowley called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Motion by Council member Arends to accept the agenda as presented; Council member Bastin seconds the motion. The motion passed.

Motion by Council member Bastin to approve the Consent Agenda which consisted of the October 4, 2022 Council minutes and to pay all the November bills; Council member Arends seconds the motion. The motion passed.
